He was also a member of the 2002 WIAA Boys State Basketball champions and won 4 WIAA State Championships in Track and Field as a hurdler and in the relays. He went on to the University of Wisconsin and competed in track and field in the Heptathlon, Pentathlon and Decathlon earning All-Conference and National honors and was the Big10 Conference Indoor Heptathlon champion in 2005. Dr. Brown is an Emergency Room physician working in the Madison area and living in Madison.
